Grace and peace to the People of Tuscola, for our God in heaven,

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Why are we here?

Where do we want to go?

These two questions aree at the heart of an book called The Unstuck Church by Tony Morgan. This book covers the stages of a church's life cycle: launching, momentum growth, strategic growth, sustained health, maintenance, preservation, and life support. It also discusses why the church may be in certain stages of the life cycle an how to move effectively to other stages. In momentum growth, Morgan identifies that churches should plan out the mission, vision, and strategy to answer these questions. So, let's look at the first two.

Why are we here?

I take this as two separate questions: one, why are you, as an individual, at this church or want to come to this church, and two, in Morgan's words, why do we (the church) exist.

These are both simple and challenging questions to answer. I alway say that when I teach this in a group setting, I will not accept as an answer 'because my parents came here and made me go here' or 'because I always have'.

Why are we here? We should be able to list our experiences with God and how we see the church helping us continue to be in that relationship.

Why does the church exist?

I encourage people not to say that 'it will always be here'. Most churches in the US have only existed for 200 years, especially here in Illinois. A bar in England has excisted since 947 AD, the Pouch House, far longer than Methodists have been there. This question of why we are here as individuals and the church must have an answer because, without it, we cannot answer the following question:

where do we want to go?

Where we want to go is called vision.

One of my "favorite" interview questions is: where do you see yourself in 5 years? I Because, much like the Muppet Elmo answered, "5 years? I don't know what I am doing in the next 5 hours." Bust as a chuch that intends to exist forever, 5 yeas in the life of a church is 5 hours. The Vision takes that question and says we know why we exist, so what do we want to do with our existence? The churches that have vision, growth, and healthy goals continue to happen; the churches that say 'well, we exist, and that is all that matters', usually end up in the life support stage of the church's life cycle.


We are asking ourselves these questions, which will be the topic of discussion for the next Church Council meeting and the two meetings we will have this month. They are called cottage meetings. We are holding them to get input from church members on these questions to help the church have a clear Mission and Vision Statement.

I know this church can do that as we have done so before. Methodis have moved here, built buildings to meet in, created programs for the safety and care of children, and continued to feed those who need food.

They had a vision of a better future they could help create.




