
and let in the new and fresh.





Tuscola United Women in Faith

YOU CAN HELP! – Tuscola United Women in Faith is leading a church-wide effort to purchase a new ice-marker and commercial refrigerator. The lack of a large capacity ice-maker and adequate refrigeration is causing problems with funeral dinners, SAM Pantry, and other events. The problems will only escalate as daily temperatures rise. The estimate to purchase both is \$7,000. An anonymous donor has stepped forward to do a dollar-for-dollar match to each dollar donated, up to \$3,500. So the goal is to raise \$3,500 from church members and to do so before the end of April. Make out your checks to TUMC and in the note area, write "Ice-Maker/

Refrigerator." Checks may be given to Sarah or Pastor Terri...or members can take their check to the church and put in Sarah's mailbox...or put it in the collection plate on Sunday...or mail it in to the church. Please look into your heart and donate whatever you can...no donation is too small! If the total donations exceed the cost of the equipment, the remainder will go into the church's maintenance fund to help with future repairs.

To the Laity of TUMC

Psalm 28:6-9

The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me.

My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him.

I read this uplifting Psalm as part of a devotion in the Upper Room this week. Do our hearts leap for joy when we think of God? Do we praise God as we should? Do we trust God's provision for us? If each of us would hold this promise of God's help in our hearts as we trust in him, there is nothing we cannot accomplish or face. This includes whatever is in store for the Methodist church world-wide and even for TUMC.



Trustees met on March 16. Jason Swearingen reported on the SAM pantry open house. The purpose of the open house was to introduce the pantry to members of the community who do not know of the its existence or its purpose. The church's farm ground is currently farmed by Toby Ring for \$300/acre cash rent. The lease will be offered to Mr. Ring for the coming year at the same rate. Leon Kinney will contact the city regarding the water that does not drain from the parking lot by the education wing. Karen Benner will research the possibility of obtaining a commercial grade robot vacuum. A motion was passed allowing TUWF to fundraise for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator and/or ice maker contingent on approval by trustees. Kiwanis were given permission to use the church grounds for their tables for the Easter egg hunt on April 1. They will also be allowed to use the fellowship hall for a trauma doll workshop on a date to be determined. Leon Kinney has volunteered to be the point person for the columbarium. Currently, there are only two mowing teams for the summer. The ideal number of teams would be four so each team would only mow once a month. Mowing takes around 2 to 2-1/2 hours to complete. If you would like to be part of a team, please let Pastor Terri or Bruce Wood know.

Church Council met on 3/20. A special charge conference was held before the regular meeting to approve the following committee memberships:

Amy Griffith - SPRC Committee, serving 2023-2025

Karen Benner – Trustees Committee, serving 2023-2025

Les Hall – Finance Committee, serving 2023-2025

In addition, on behalf of the Finance Committee, a motion was approved to change the budget line item for Insurance Expense from \$12,500.00 to \$17,000.00 to more accurately estimate 2023 insurance expense. The charge conference was adjourned and the Council moved into their regular meeting. The following reports were made.

For **SAM pantry**, Margie Delheimer reported that she will retire as pantry coordinator effective March 31, 2023. In 2022, Margie put in 504 service hours and put around 2000 miles on her car for the benefit of pantry. The Council members thanked Margie for her many years of service. Pastor Terri will be meeting with key pantry volunteers and pantry board members to find a new coordinator. A motion was made and passed stipulating that the monthly fee for SAM pantry's use of the building be \$800, retroactive to January1, 2023.

The **Missions and Evangelism** team is working on a plan for reaching out to the parents and the children who are picked up from North Ward. A second Fall Festival is in the planning stages and will most likely be held in October.

The **Worship** team will be meeting in two weeks for the final planning for Easter. The Good Friday service will be April 7 at 6:00 PM. On Easter Day, April 9, there will be a Sunrise service at 6:30 AM followed by a breakfast.

Children, Youth and Families committee is planning for VBS to be held on June 20-22. The theme this year is "Pets Unleashed-Where Jesus Cares for You."

SPRC reported that Kathleen Dyer is back to work as janitor. Shelbi Fleener has been hired to do the vacuuming for Kathleen. **Finance** recommended that a smaller scanner/copier be purchased to replace the current one. In an attempt to curb the color printing charges, only Pastor Terri, Cheryl Warren and Sarah Evans can print color copies. Dave Butler reported that the financial secretary has been advised to post interest from Edward Jones on the financial reports retroactive to January 1, 2023.

In **TUWF** news, the Mother-Daughter banquet will be held on April 20. The group will also be fundraising for a refrigerator and ice maker for the kitchen. An anonymous donor will match the funds raised up to \$3500.

The **Christian Justice** team screened the PBS Frontline documentary "Growing Up Trans" on February 26. There was a good discussion afterward as we talked through varying opinions on how to care for transgender children.

The **Congregational Care** team packed and delivered eighteen bags containing various items such toiletries, reading material, and cookies to home-bound members.

The next Church Council meeting is May 15 at 6:00 PM.
