The month of April and the beginning of May have been a very active time in the life of the Church, Both globally and locally. This is why this newsletter was not out on the First of May, the church has been working and I wanted to get you all the information I was able to. This note for your pastor will be spilt into two sections local church news and the Global news from our postponed 2020 General Conference being held in 2024.

The first news I wanted to bring to you is that starting May 15, 2024, the Rev. Kim Woods will be our new Director of Children and Youth Ministries. Pastor Kim is a provisional deacon in our Conference. She has a Bachelor's degree in English and a Masters in Christian education, as well as an extensive history working with children, youth, and young adults in a variety of churches and communities. The congregation will be able to meet Pastor Kim on May 12th.


The second news is about some of the decisions made at the postponed 2020 General Conference. The General Conference spent two weeks making changes and updates to the Book of Discipline, as well as nominations for the global boards and agencies, and setting a budget for the next quadrennium. Because of the changes in the makeup of the church, the global budgets will shrink for this next quadrennium, saving local churches money in their apportionments and allowing more funds to stay in local churches and in the annual conferences. One of the biggest changes that is currently in the public new cycle is the long-time ban on LGBTQ clergy has been removed, as well as many passages containing harmful language to LGBTQ groups and persons. In addition, weddings are now left up to the individual clergy and congregation whether to perform or not in their local context. Also of note is that the language of disaffiliations had been removed from the Book of Discipline and will no longer be an option for congregations to pursue, however any church that has disaffiliated can be reincorporated with permission from the annual conference in which they would reside.

It is often said that the only two things that are certain is death and taxes, but I think there is one more, change. One of the most important things about change is not just that it happened but also what we do once it has happened. These changes in the local and global church, we hope and pray, will help us to fulfill God calling on our lives found in John 15:12 in a command Jesus gives to the disciples "love one another as I have loved you."

There was discussion afterward. I urge any of you who can to attend these presentations by the Christian Justice team. It is our duty as Christians to learn of the injustices in the world and in our community. Who knows. A movement may start because we become informed people.


SPRC met on April 9 and approved the Lay Employee Policy Manual with some minor changes. It went into effect on 4/15 and once the individual staff members it applies to have signed it. Pastor Bennett reported that plans are in the works for a 3-day VBS. Delegates to Annual Conference will be Janet Butler and Diane Zell.

Trustees approved a motion to have All-Pro replace the leaking faucets in the church kitchen at their meeting on April 11. They also approved a motion for Pastor Bennett to

purchase and install track lighting in the downstairs bath in the parsonage. In addition, the Trustees voted to approve the amended PASS agreement regarding their use of the building. The PASS board of directors has approved the expansion of PASS to include a before school program for the 2024-2025 school year. Mowing teams were discussed as that time of the year has come. The tree by the fire pit will be cut down in May and the Youth Group will help with cleanup. We are looking for more volunteers to keep the beds around the perimeter of the church weed-free. See Bruce Wood or myself if you are interested.

The **Finance** committee met on April 22. Treasurer, Dave Butler, gave an update on the financial reports. The good news is that the church's finances are still in the black. Beginning in April, the insurance premium will be paid monthly so the "prepaid insurance" account will no longer be needed. Dave pointed out that the spike in income in December, as seen in the graph below, was due to giving by multiple attendees not a large donation by one member. Chair Dick Berg will meet with SPRC in May regarding the need for a financial secretary. Pastor Bennett will look for two church members to perform the audit.
