Grace and peace to the People of Tuscola,

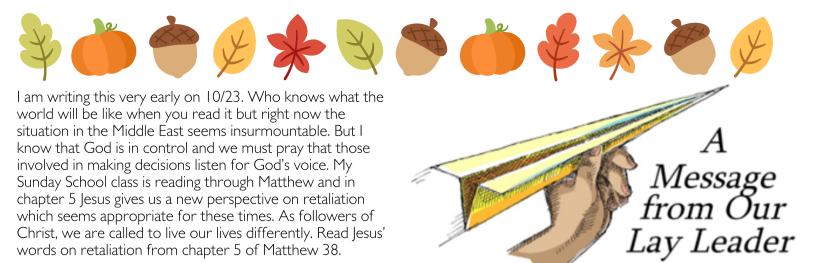
This should be a shorter newsletter than last month and thank you all who read it. Just because it is shorter doesn't mean that it will be less important. On the contrary, this note will ask us all a very important question: Why are we here? This will be the sermon series for the month of November. November is a rather interesting month in the life of the church because it starts and ends with special holidays—no, not Halloween and Thanksgiving, but rather All Saints Day and Christ the King Sunday. All Saints Day is when we celebrate all persons in the church's life who have gone to the church triumphant, and Christ the King Sunday celebrates the end of the church's preaching year. The Preaching year, or the Lectionary year, starts with the first Sunday of Advent. Both holidays help us see that we are here for a time and that the life of the church goes on past us.

We as Christians should take time to think about why we are here in the church, why this church, and what it is that this church needs and should be doing to build the Kingdom of heaven here on the earth. This is my challenge for you this month. I do not seek to give you these answers in my sermon series but to help you ask them of yourself and of the Church. That is what the church as a whole will be asking itself as well. We, as the Tuscola United Methodist Church, also need to ask why we are here, what we need to do, and what it is that God is Calling us to do.

"You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' [a] 39 But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. 40 And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. 41 If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. 42 Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.

Finance committee met on October 9 to discuss the financial picture for the remainder of this year and the coming year. The first order of business was to determine how to encourage members to contribute what remains of their 2023 estimates of giving. It was decided that Dick Berg would speak to the congregation on 10/15. The proposed budget for 2024 showed a deficit of \$78,552. Pastor Bennett said that he would speak at Consecration Sunday on 10/22. He also stated that he would not continue the youth programs after the first of the year if no one is hired for the position of Children and Youth director. He feels he cannot devote the hours needed to fulfill the duties of pastor if he is also the youth director. There was discussion regarding where and how to find the money to hire someone for the position and, also, how to reduce the deficit for the coming year. The options discussed were to cut staff positions, reduce salaries, do a fundraiser and have faith that the estimates of giving will be enough. Ultimately, a motion was passed by the committee to reject the budget as presented and to convey to SPRC that the consensus of the committee was the pastor's salary should remain at the amount submitted in the SPRC budget.

SPRC met on 10/10 and discussed the open children and youth director position. They also discussed their portion of the budget returned by the finance committee for SPRC's review.

Trustees met on 10/12. Pastor Bennett reported that SAM pantry may need more storage space. The parsonage was the next point of discussion. Jerry Reynolds will arrange for the broken storm windows to be repaired. Pastor Bennett will look at purchasing a storm door for the back door. He will also contact All-Pro to set up an appointment to perform maintenance on the furnaces at the parsonage. A motion was passed to sell the bricks that had been purchased over 20 years ago for the sanctuary. They had been stored locally and there were costs associated with the storage. The sale of the organ to the church in Wisconsin fell through because they want to hear it being played before purchasing. Pastor Bennett will call them to see if they will take it, as is, for free. The space that will be freed up if the organ is gone can be used for MOPS or SAM. The committee decided that gutter guards should be installed at the parsonage. Pastor Bennett will contact Roofs by Rodger for an estimate of the cost. Ameren completed the upgrade of the lights at the church at a total cost of \$5900 which should be recovered in a year. The dispute with BluSky Restoration over repairs at the parsonage related to a water leak was successfully closed with help from John Watson. The church paid the insurance deductible of \$2500 and our insurance company, Church Mutual, reopened the case and paid the remainder. The church owns three snowblowers which are stored in the parsonage garage so it was decided that two should be sold. The small lawn mower that has been listed for sale on Facebook and needs some work has not been purchased so the trustees decided to offer it for free to anyone who wants it. The trustees also discussed their portion of the budget for 2024 that was rejected by the finance committee.

A special **Church Council** meeting was held on 10/16 to discuss only the 2024 budget. The members of SPRC, trustees, finance and church council were present and were seated at tables with a mix of members so that ideas could be discussed with each other to get a new perspective on how to approach reducing the budget deficit of \$78, 552. There was discussion on which items in the budget could be reduced and then an error was discovered in an Excel spreadsheet so the 2024 deficit was determined to be \$59,218. The only item in the budget that must be approved before the Charge Conference on 10/29 is the pastor compensation package. Therefore, a motion was made and passed to accept that package of \$80,899 as put forth by SPRC. The remainder of the 2024 budget must be accepted by Church Council before December 31. It was agreed that the 2024 deficit would be addressed after the estimates of giving are in. Below you will find the budget numbers.

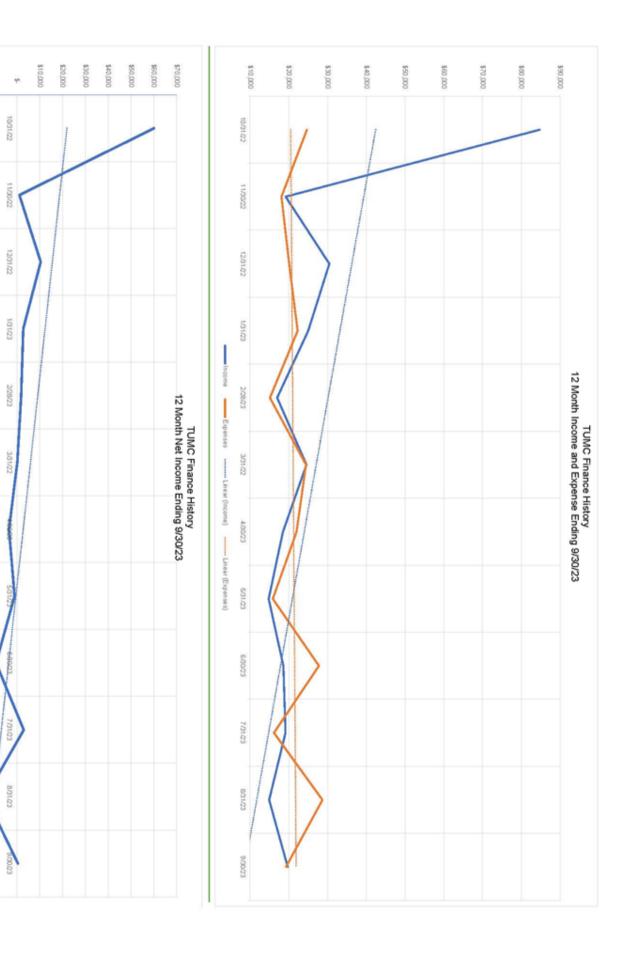
