

Dear Church Family,

Can you image stepping out of bed on Christmas morning and realizing that you've done nothing to prepare for it? There are no lights. No Christmas tree. No special trip to the grocery store to buy food for an amazing dinner. No invitations issued to family and friends, and no invitations accepted either. There are no presents. No trips to church for Christmas Eve service.

You haven't even sung one Christmas carol.

That is an impossible thought for most of us! Even the secular world can't imagine Christmas with no preparation. And yet, most of us slide into Easter with no preparation at all. We might dye some eggs for an hour one afternoon. Maybe buy our favorite chocolate (Reece's Peanut Butter Eggs anyone?). But compared to Christmas, there is almost no time given to the

most important holiday in the Christian year.

It's easy to understand why. We like joyful celebrations. We don't want the suffering Savior on the cross. We don't want to examine our own lives too closely looking for sin. We don't want the darkness. We just want to wake up and celebrate the true joy of Easter morning. Little girls in fancy dresses. Up tempo music. Chocolate. Children dashing around the lawn looking

for eggs. Ham dinners. But let me ask you this. Could you ever really experience joy if you didn't know what sorrow was? Could you understand the concept of light if you had never stood in darkness?

It's the same for Easter. We rejoice on Easter morning because we have examined what the world would have been like if Jesus had not risen from the dead. We celebrate our relationship with God because we have spent time remembering the times

we have wandered away from God.

This Lent, I encourage you to really embrace the practice of Lent. Take time to be still and reflect on what God really did for us that dark Friday thousands of years ago. Take time to, as Sarah Phillips states: "open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it is not just another day at

church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer." Perhaps consider giving something up for Lent or add something in such as a daily time of prayer or hymn singing. Use the opening meditation time in church to prepare your heart. Just like Christmas, the joy of Easter is increased when we better

understand why we're celebrating, and when we take time to truly prepare.


### Youth Group News


