



Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. 6 I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. 7 So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. 8 The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and each will receive wages according to their own labor. 9 For we are God's coworkers, working together; you are God's field, God's building."

You are in good hands going forward. Not just Pastor Bennett although, yes – you are in good hands with him! But you are in God's hands. Allow yourself to continue growing in numbers, in discipleship, in personal, spiritual growth.

Many moons ago when I first started working as a computer systems engineer, I had to read numerous IBM manuals. Quite often I would come across a page that said "this page left intentionally blank." I often wondered why IBM did this. Would I need that deleted information in the future? What had been there? Our lives are like that blank page when we accept Jesus as our savior. God wipes away our sins and we have a clean slate, a "blank" page, with which to start anew. We have



the assurance that God no longer holds those sins against us. Paul states this in 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" Those words give such comfort! We are a new person when we follow Christ! IBM no longer needed the information on the blank page and we no longer need or have our sins listed on the "page" of our lives. Thank you, Jesus!

Throughout May, **Trustees** have been planning the work required to ready the parsonage for Pastor Bennett's arrival. Repairs will be made the week between Pastor Terri's departure on June 12 and Pastor Bennett's arrival on June 19. The flooring in the kitchen, hallway and downstairs bathroom will be replaced with rigid core, waterproof vinyl flooring for just under \$3000. This was required because some of the parquet floor in the hallway had been damaged beyond repair. The broken dishwasher was replaced and paid for by a very generous member of our congregation. The upstairs banks of windows on the east and west will be replaced during the summer by Roofs by Rodger at a cost of \$5200. The stairway to the second story will be sanded and sealed and the upstairs carpeting cleaned at a cost of \$150. Some of the downstairs windows need their weights fixed so the windows will open properly. A new Illinois law that went into effect in 2023 requires sealed smoke alarms with 10-year batteries so those will be installed. These last two items along with some others minor fixes will be completed by trustee members. These expenses are absolutely needed and more could and should be done to keep the parsonage in better repair. Going forward, we need to consider that the parsonage needs new windows and is not ADA-compliant. A big thank you to Leon Kinney for replacing the missing shingles on the southeast slope of the fellowship hall of the church.


Church Council met on 5/15 and the following committees made their reports. **Pastor Terri** reported that the website and email addresses for staff had to change from using .org to .com. **Children, family and youth** director, Cheryl Warren, is looking for volunteers for VBS which will be June 20-22 in the evenings. Kid's Club met for the last time this school year on 5/10 and will resume when school starts in the fall.

The audit is still being worked on and should be ready for the **Finance** committee's June meeting. **Trustees** requested that money from Manna Café be moved to the trustees' account for use on the parsonage repairs. This was approved by the council. Once again, it was suggested that the organ be sold. Some time ago, there had been a buyer for the organ but due to some resistance, the plan was abandoned. This will be brought up with trustees for consideration again. There was discussion regarding the location of the brick that had been purchased for the sanctuary at the time the church was built.

United Women in Faith will be hosting a fundraiser brunch at the Smith House on June 11 at 10:30. A funeral dinner was served on 5/15 and the new refrigerator and ice maker were greatly

appreciated.

The new **SAM** pantry board consisting of Jerry Reynolds, Darcy Sementi, Dorothy Voyles, Jerry Leonard and Dave Butler met and created vision and mission statements, determined the composition of the board and assigned individual responsibilities within the pantry. They continue to work on a job description for the pantry coordinator position. The board will assess the

SPRC questioned whether there are enough funds to cover the moving expense for the new pastor. A portion of the estimated cost is supposed to be set aside each year in the budget. The moving expense is expected to be approximately \$5000.


The **Christian Justice** committee reported Cara and Paul Doan from Restoration 1 would be giving a presentation about their work in helping victims of human trafficking on May 21. The Council voted to move **coffee hour** to 9:30 AM beginning on July 2 when our new pastor arrives. The church service will begin at 10:00.

Finance Committee met on 5/22. Financial secretary, Sarah Evans, and Mike Ovca have been working on the audit. There was discussion regarding the differences in the two Treasurer's reports and whether both are necessary. Insurance on the buildings owned by the church was discussed and Trustees will be asked to increase the liability and umbrella insurance on the church building and the insurance on the contents of the mower shed. Chairman, Dick Berg, created a report to explain how the funds invested with Edward Jones are allocated. Church treasurer, Dave Butler, will be stepping down in a few months.

SPRC met on 5/23 to discuss the brunch in Pastor Terri's honor. Pastor Bennett requested someone introduce him to the shut-ins and nursing home residents when he arrives and Patty Russell volunteered to do this. Chair, Mary Ann Pattenaude, reported that the moving company will bill the church instead of requiring payment on the moving day.
