# Merry Christmas to the people of TUMC!

Read these prophetic words from Isaiah 9:2 The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.



And from John 8:12 When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

We have been given the greatest Christmas gift of all – our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! May we keep our eyes, always, on that wonderful light that came at Christmas so long ago.

Becca Dunn, the new PASS director, and Harvey Pettry, a PASS board member, were in attendance as the **Trustees** met on November 9 to discuss the PASS rental agreement. The rooms and times of use will be updated in the current agreement. Ms. Dunn asked that the use of the playground equipment be added and the trustees agreed to this. The leasing agreement will also be changed from three years to one year. Ms. Dunn expressed her desire to grow the PASS program and answered other questions pertaining to PASS for the trustees. SAM pantry is still looking for a coordinator. Jason Swearingen reported that 94 family members were served on the previous Wednesday. They will continue distributing food one day a week. A motion was passed giving lerry Reynolds the authorization to pursue looking for an outdoor walk-in cooler for the pantry's use which would be placed outside the kitchen door. The roof on the church, parsonage and parsonage garage have been replaced. Gutters were also installed and gutter guards are in place at the parsonage locations. Yearly furnace maintenance has been performed at the parsonage. Pastor Bennett will contact Ameren to see if they have any programs for replacing the parsonage water heater with a heat pump water heater. A new policy will be put in place for memorial donations. If the total amount donated for an individual is less than \$1000, the money will be placed in a memorial fund to be used at the trustees' discretion. The playground fence will be placed at the border of the playground and will be black enamel and four feet tall. There has been \$5400 collected for this project. A hydrangea bush has been planted in the area just to the east of Pastor Bennett's office in memory of Joan Cross by the Doc and Mary Smith family. The thermostats in the building will be set at 62 degrees for unoccupied rooms and at 68 degrees when occupied during the winter months. It was agreed to give MOPS a key for access to the building for setup and for meetings when the church is not open.

**SPRC** met on November 14. The church is still searching for a children and youth director candidate. If you know of an individual who would be a good fit for this position, please contact the church. Pastor Bennett reported that many churches in the area are also looking for someone to fill this position. In the meantime, Pastor

Bennett will continue in this role until a replacement is hired. If the position is unfilled by the end of the school year, there will have to be discussion on whether he can continue to do so. Pastor Bennett has formed a group consisting of United Methodist pastors from Douglas county and Tolono which will meet once a month.

The **Finance** committee received some welcome news at their meeting on November 20. Pastor Bennett reported that the estimates of giving for 2024 totaled \$170,908 which was growth over the \$141,940 pledged in 2023. This was due to an increase in the amount pledged by 39 giving units and not an increase in the number of people completing estimates of giving nor by people moving from "identifiable giving". Pastor Bennett reported that an individual in the church will pay the entire yearly salary for the children and youth director position for one year if/when they are hired. In addition, the trustees will donate an amount to be determined to the general operating fund after the roof insurance claim is closed. These donations will move the 2024 budget into the black and therefore, a motion was passed to approve the budget. See below for the new 2024 budget. John Watson will look into doing a golf outing at Iron Horse in 2024 as a fundraiser. Mike Ovca has decided to resign as auditor for the church after 13 years in this role, and we appreciate his years of service. Pastor Bennett will contact other churches to determine who they use for audits. The church received a notice from our banking institution, First Mid Bank and Trust, stating that another customer in an institution they have recently purchased has the church's same checking account number. We will ask that our account number be changed and First Mid will assist Sarah Evans, financial secretary, with all that is required to make this transition.

The **Church Council** met on 11/20 also. In addition to the previous information from the **Trustee** meeting in a preceding paragraph, Pastor Bennett reported that the cracked window glass at the parsonage has been repaired. **Finance** chair, Dick Berg, reported that we are hoping that the deficit in the 2023 budget will be made up in December which normally sees an increase in giving. **SPRC** chair, Mary Ann Pattenaude, stated that group is working on updating the lay employee handbook. Please see previous paragraphs for additional information from the Finance and SPRC meetings. **Children's council** has not met but Pastor Bennett reported that the Junior and Senior High youth groups will be combined moving forward. Georgia Wilkinson, president of the **Women United in Faith**, stated that they provided a meal for the youth group and will be doing so again in 2024. Chili for Chaddock was a success as reported by Jerry Leonard for **United Methodist Men**. They will be able to send \$500 to Chaddock even though expenses were higher. The caterer for their monthly meetings requires a certain number of attendees before they will commit to provide the meal so the members are still attempting to determine what format their meetings will take. Jerry also reported for **SAM pantry**. They still do not have a coordinator although someone has expressed interest but they cannot start until May. In the meantime, Margie Delheimer is helping in this capacity. The pantry has started seeing an increase in the number of people being served. They have begun handing out lesspopular government commodities, such as garbanzo beans, to make room for more food. The Christian Justice team is hoping to have Dayspring Native American United Methodist Church come and conduct a worship service at TUMC. The Worship team discussed the Christmas Eve services. There will be the fourth Advent Sunday worship on the morning of 12/24 and then a family Christmas Eve service at 7:00 PM and the traditional candlelight Christmas Eve service at 11:00 PM. If none of those times will work for you, Pastor Bennett will also be conducting a morning service at 8:30 and a Christmas Eve service at 3:30 PM at Pesotum UMC on 12/24. There will be a Blue Christmas service on 12/21 at TUMC. The Congregational Care team is creating a digital list of shut-ins. The hospice care presentation by Sarah Bush Lincoln was well attended. The team is considering a class on CPR and scams that target the elderly. The **Evangelism and Missions** team will again hold their Fall Festival next year. This team will determine to which organization our Christmas offering will go. In the Pastor's Report, Pastor Bennett stated he will continue in the role as children and youth director until someone is hired or summer arrives. He has been in contact with the conference regarding the lack of applicants and they feel the low pay is the reason. The Mattoon and Sullivan United Methodist churches are also looking to fill this position. Pastor Bennett informed Council members that TUMC has been chosen by the conference to send an additional lay person to annual conference to equalize the vote between the clergy and the laity. If you are interested in attending, please see Pastor Bennett. Church Council Chair, Wayne Ward will be stepping down in January and was thanked by the members for his years of service.

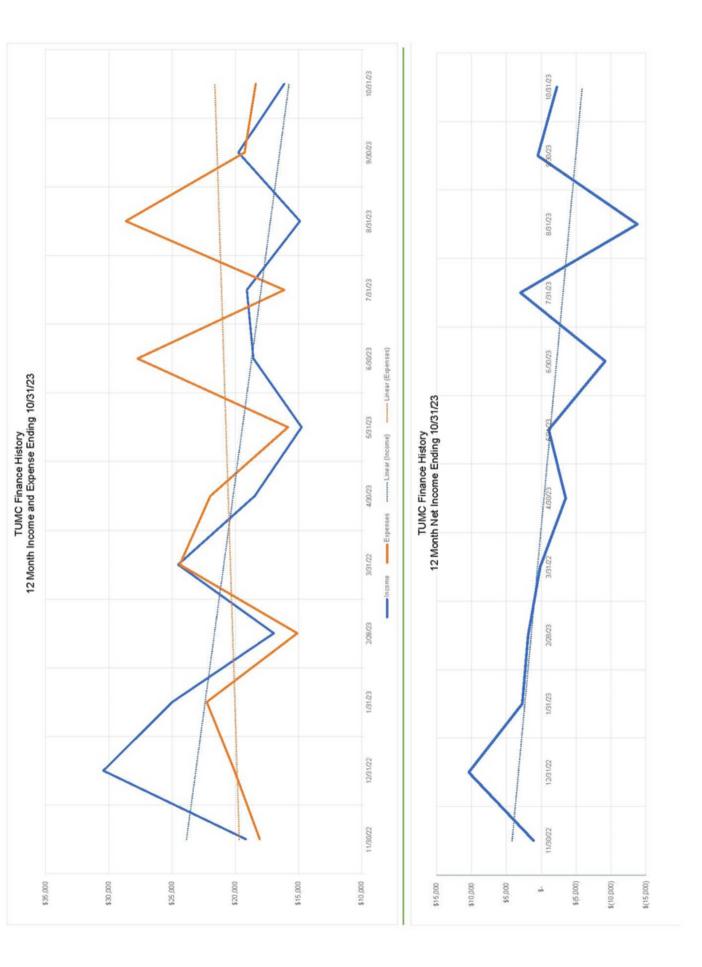

Members cook and serve funeral dinners,serve on most church committees,teach Sunday School classes,and meet monthly to stay informed about missions,where our money goes,legislation being considered,plans to take action,etc.

If you have a desire or passion to put your faith,hope,and love into action for women,children,and youth,we have a place for you. Consider joining an existing circle(Rebekah meets the 4th Monday,7:00 pm,usually at church,and Rachel meets 4th Tuesday,1:00 at Flesors' Candy Kitchen.
