### From the Pastors Pen...

As I write this note today, I am sitting at Flesor's enjoying the atmosphere, food, and the community we have together here in Tuscola. I want to share some of the changes that have taken place over the last month and changes coming in the future for the church and how those changes represent how we as a church can grow into the call on our life that is celebrated at Pentecost. We are called to be the church, not just attend a church.

One of the biggest changes in our local church is the hiring of Pastor Kim Woods as the Director of Children and Youth Ministries. Pastor Kim has started leading the programs and getting ready for VBS this month. We have been honored with a gift this year by one of our members in covering the salary and benefits for Pastor Kim's position for this year. When the church was working on the budget last year for this year we knew of the gift being given for this purpose only and this is one of the reasons we had a balanced budget. This gift is for one year and so at the church, we will have to work hard to increase giving next year to make sure we can continue this ministry that Pastor Kim is leading. On top of the part-time duties as Director of Children and Youth Ministries, Pastor Kim met with the SAM pantry board and has volunteered as the new part-time Coordinator for the pantry. As the coordinator, Pastor Kim would be the public face of the pantry as well as doing a lot of work behind the scenes. The SAM pantry has been a ministry of Tuscola UMC for over thirty years. We want the SAM pantry to serve the people in need in Douglas County and to continue to do so for a long time.

One of the changes coming in the future that we are already working on is what is called a Simplified Accountability Structure. This will change how the boards for the church are organized. SAS is also often called the one-board model. At the basic level, it is one primary board making big decisions and setting the mission and vision for the church and has small teams of members doing specific things that need to be done. Under Pastor Terri, the church began this work, in teams like Christian Justice, NOW, and worship teams. We are now working with the conference to get all of what we need to move to this model. There will be town hall meetings this summer and fall to talk with the congregation about what this means how it can help us to become better at the administration of the church and how it can help the ministries of the church continue to grow

I know there are times we as a church have to talk about the business of the church, but if we talk about the business side of the church and make it work well, then we can focus on the reason God has called us to be the Church and help all that we can.



**SPRC** met on 5/14 and learned the following. Employees have received the revised Lay Employee manual. Our custodian, Kathleen Dyer, will return to work on June 1. We thank Tina Kestner for her hard work as she filled in for Kathleen during her absence. Pastor Kim Woods will be in attendance every Sunday as Director of Children and Youth Ministries beginning June 1. Pastor Bennett reported that he has eight people interested in becoming new members of the church and will be holding new member classes soon.

The **Finance** committee met on 5/20 and treasurer, Dave Butler, reported that though we are slightly in the red, income has been trending upward and expenses are down. The Lee scholarship recipient received \$500 and the McCumber scholarship recipient received \$1000. There was discussion regarding the audit committee. We have one member willing to serve and a suggestion was made to look to an area United Methodist church for another person to serve. At least, two people are needed for this committee. Chair, Dick Berg, and Pastor Bennett will work on a financial report to present to the congregation after July 1.

The **Church Council** met on 5/20 also. The following reports were given at the meeting. Members heard from our new **Director of Children and Youth Ministries**, Pastor Kim Woods, for the first time. She reported that the youth group will meet periodically during the summer. Pastor Kim will preach once a quarter in addition to doing the children's moments each Sunday. This will allow Pastor Bennett to speak at Brookstone.

**Finance** reported that so far this year \$3000 has been earned in interest from the funds in CDs at Edward Jones. The church budget is in the red by \$1600.

Cheryl Bozarth, **SPRC** chair, was pleased to report that Pastor Kim had been interviewed by SPRC members and, in a separate interview, she spoke with a high schooler and two mothers of children who attend our programs. All were pleased with the interview process and the decision was made to hire her as Director of Children and Youth Ministries. In other news from SPRC, the revised Lay Employee

manual is complete.

The Missions and Evangelism team and the Congregational Care Team have combined to form the **Nurture, Outreach and Witness team**. This new team plans to have a presence at the Sparks in the Parks celebration and at the library's movie nights. May baskets were made and delivered to shut-ins and to Brookstone. They also plan to have the sheriff give a talk on scams, especially those perpetrated on the elderly, in June.

The **Christian Justice** team is working on a program regarding trauma and resiliency to be presented in June. In October, they plan to have a program on domestic violence.

Pastor Bennett reported for the **Worship team**. He stated that the middle hymn in the church service will be replaced with a contemporary song this summer.


Jerry Leonard is still attempting to get U**nited Methodist Men** re-established. He says they will continue to do Chili for Chaddock.


The **United Women in Faith** provided sandwiches and cookies for a program at the Atwood Baptist church on May 13 regarding drug endangered children reported President Jan Mann. The East District will hold its fall meeting on September 14 in Sullivan. The annual salad supper will be held September 19. There will not be a fall fundraiser this year. In exciting news, they may have a new circle starting soon.

The **SAM Pantry** board reported the number of people they have been serving has decreased.

Pastor Bennett told the Council in the **Pastor's Report** that he will speak once a quarter at Brookstone. He will begin the task of bringing the Strategic Accountable Structure (SAS) to TUMC. According to the IGRC (Illinois Great Rivers Conference) website the purpose of the SAS is to provide streamlined decision-making for the administrative ministries of the church in order to free up people to serve in ministry with their community. A coach will be working with Pastor Bennett and the congregation to implement this new church structure. Pastor Bennett will do a town hall type of meeting to bring more information to the congregation. Because Pastor Kim is a Deacon in the United Methodist Church, she has been appointed to serve TUMC by the Bishop effective officially June 1. Here is the official definition of a deacon from the UMC website: *Deacons are ordained United Methodist clergy who lead the church in relating Christians to their ministries in the world through worship leadership, preaching, teaching, nurturing spiritual vitality and leading ministries of service, love, and justice.* In order to meet some of these criteria, Pastor Kim will serve on the Christian Justice team.






